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### **ANTANANARIVO > Capital city of Madagascar**

- 823,11 km2 (agglo)
- 2.5 M population (2018)
- 10% National population
- 50% of urban population
- 45% cultivated lands
- 20% household are household farmers



65 municipalities located less than 100 km from the city centre

This area supplies the Capital City urban consumption

- Future urban sprawl projections (2035)
- Potential agricultural economy and food industries








## **ANTANANARIVO** > Strong vulnerability to climate hazards

2017 - Antananarivo's engagement to MUFPP and the CITYFOOD global network


## 2019 – MUFPP Monitoring Framework project (external parties: FAO, RUAF, LAURIER University) Outcome: Indicators to account for data, prioritization, action planning

- Integrate MUFPP activities as an inter departamental activity in the Municipality (Dir. of Economical Development, Urban Agriculture service, Dir. of International Cooperation and partnerships, decentralised cooperation)
- Reassembling a multi-stakeholder group of actors 2018/20 Antananarivo becomes a city of reference for Madagascar local food policy to ensure system resilience and access to healthy, affordable, sustainable and culturally acceptable food.



## 2020 > food strategy for the City


- Strengthening partnerships for access of vulnerable populations to healthy food: School gardens (09 pilot projects)

- Technical support for an Oprhan center
- "Mamboly aho" mobile application to diffuse urban agriculture practices between urban farmers
- MUFPP: Steering committee; Africa region
- Green Cities Initiative: shwocase and action planning to improve for resilience
- CRFS FAO Resilient food systems to tackle climate stresses and shocks.



## **CITY REGION FOOD SYSTEM:**

Strengthening the climate resilience of food systems in urban regions through adapted production systems:

- Component 1: Multi-stakeholder engagement and multi-level governance.
- Component 2: Comprehensive Climate Risk Assessments in CRFS.
- Component 3: Development of policies and strategies on climate resilience.
- Component 4: Capacity development of vulnerable stakeholders in climate-resilient good practices relating to CRFS and in knowledge sharing through South-South cooperation.
